Briefing Purpose

- The Delegation of Authority Master Policy, Resolution 2018-01, requires an annual review of that policy by the Managing Members.
- Alliance staff has reviewed the current Master Policy and provides recommendations for updates and corrections.
- Staff is seeking Managing Member approval of the 2018 Master Policy.



Background

- The Alliance Master Policy is structured to:
 - Ensure proper oversight by the Managing Members.
 - Serves as the primary delegation of administrative authority to the Chief Executive Officer.
 - Provide transparency so that actions are visible.
 - Provide flexibility to allow the CEO to respond to needs and opportunities.



Background

- The process to develop this document was led by Commissioners Albro (Port of Seattle) and Commission Johnson (Port of Tacoma).
- Staff from both homeports conducted an extensive comparison of the respective Resolutions of Delegated Authority.
- This review, and the collective input of both commissions, resulted in the development of the NWSA Resolution of Delegated Authority.
