


T5 Dredging ERL Disposal Increase Authorization

- For Port of Seattle Commission only to vote:
 - Request Port of Seattle Commission authorization for the Executive Director or their delegate to increase the total costs not to exceed from \$700,000 to \$1,100,000 for executing a change order for upland disposal of a portion of the T5 Dredging Project under Port of Seattle management, Master Identification No. U00680.

Description and Location Map

 Orion Marine Construction to remove 3,200 cubic yards of sediment not suitable for inwater disposal and dispose upland at an approved facility.



Summary

• Project budget increase authorization is requested to issue a change order to Orion Construction to dispose of approximately 3,200 cubic yards of sediment at an authorized uplands disposal facility.

Background

- November 2021 \$700,000 authorized for ERL portion
 - Since then, inflation has increased project costs.
 - \$400,000 needed to cover for construction costs, contingency, and soft costs.

- Work to be executed during 2022-2023 dredging window.
 - All work will be completed by February 15, 2023.

Environmental Impacts / Review

- Permitting: There is no change in project description so all previously acquired permits apply within the existing T5 dredging permits.
- Remediation: Dredged materials will need to be disposed at an approved uplands facility.
- Water Quality: Contractors will be required to follow the water quality management plan as set forth in the permit conditions by the Washington Dept. of Ecology.
- Air Quality: N/A for dredging projects.

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
