Prior version: Create living-wage jobs and sustainable business development opportunities in Pierce County through Port leadership and direct investment.


Economic Vitality "Living Wage" Defined



MIT: Living wage is the minimum subsistence wage for persons living in the United States.

United for ALICE: The ALICE (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed) Household Survival Budget reflects the bare minimum cost to live and work in the modern economy and includes housing, childcare, food, transportation, health care, technology (a phone plan), and taxes. It does not include savings for emergencies or future goals like college or retirement.





Draft Supporting Actions

- Accumulate and assemble real estate in the Tideflats central
 peninsula that can support marine activity, the Northwest Seaport
 Alliance terminal operations, and related support functions
 consistent with the real estate investment strategy.
- Explore partnership opportunities with the Puyallup Tribe of Indians.
- Support existing and new customers/tenants by accelerating environmental cleanup, continuously improving stormwater infrastructure, directing surface water fees toward flooding prevention and repairs/replacement.
- Advance expansion of utilities to support tenant and customer needs including data service and electrification infrastructure.

Economic VitalityTideflats Interim Regulations



Tacoma City Council Action, October 20, 2020:

"I move to amend Ordinance No. 28696, extension of the Tideflats Interim Regulations, to add an additional subsection under "Be it Ordained" stating: That the Tacoma Planning Commission is hereby directed to review these Interim Regulations and recommend non-interim regulations to replace them for consideration by the City Council by April of 2021. In undertaking this work, the Commission will consider only those issues and uses initially addressed by Amended Ordinance No. 28470 and will limit the scope of work to those regulatory options reviewed in the public record. The Commission should seek substantive input from the Port of Tacoma, the Puyallup Tribe, and other governments and stakeholders of the Tacoma Tideflats. Further, the Commission will review and assess approaches to regulate the expansion of existing uses, and consider new findings of fact, including any lessons learned from permitting in the time since the regulations were put into effect, and changes to baseline conditions. The Commission's recommendations should provide clarity and predictability for industry and community, particularly given the current COVID-19 crisis and economic impacts."

- Transportation and Capital Facilities Plan
- Public Participation and Outreach

Subarea planning allows for the establishment of a shared, long-term vision, and a more coordinated approach to development, environmental review and protection, and strategic capital investments in a focused area.

Completion of a subarea plan will support the ongoing eligibility for and prioritization of transportation funding in the Port of Tacoma Manufacturing and Industrial Center, and a well-developed plan for the Tideflats will provide great regional benefit.

Draft Supporting Actions

- Protect Pierce County's manufacturing land base by continually advocating for the protection of land zoned to allow for manufacturing and industrial uses.
- Participate in policy-making efforts in support of port related land use and mobility needs at all levels of government.
- Engage in planning efforts for infrastructure (utilities, broadband, water, sewer, etc.) that support industry needs.
- Collaborate with the Northwest Seaport Alliance on an assessment of facilities and strategies to address potential impacts of hazards and sea level rise affecting port properties and operations.
- Seek necessary permits and resources to ensure adequate navigational capacity for the needs of shipping line customers.
