**Asian Gypsy Moth (AGM)**  
Pest alert in urban & rural areas. The AGM is a highly invasive species that can cause significant damage to trees and infrastructure. It is currently spreading across the UK and is a major threat to our forests and parks.

**What to look for:** The AGM caterpillars are small, green and black, and can be found on trees and shrubs. They are most active in late summer and autumn.
