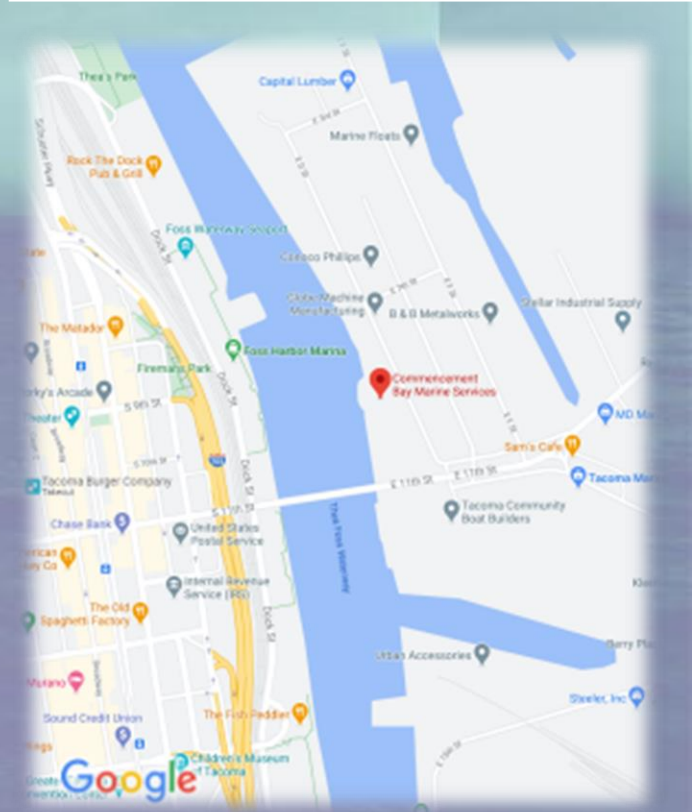
The Youth Marine Foundation is the premier on-water 501(c)3 nonprofit that provides hands-on maritime training and marine science programs for youth year round.

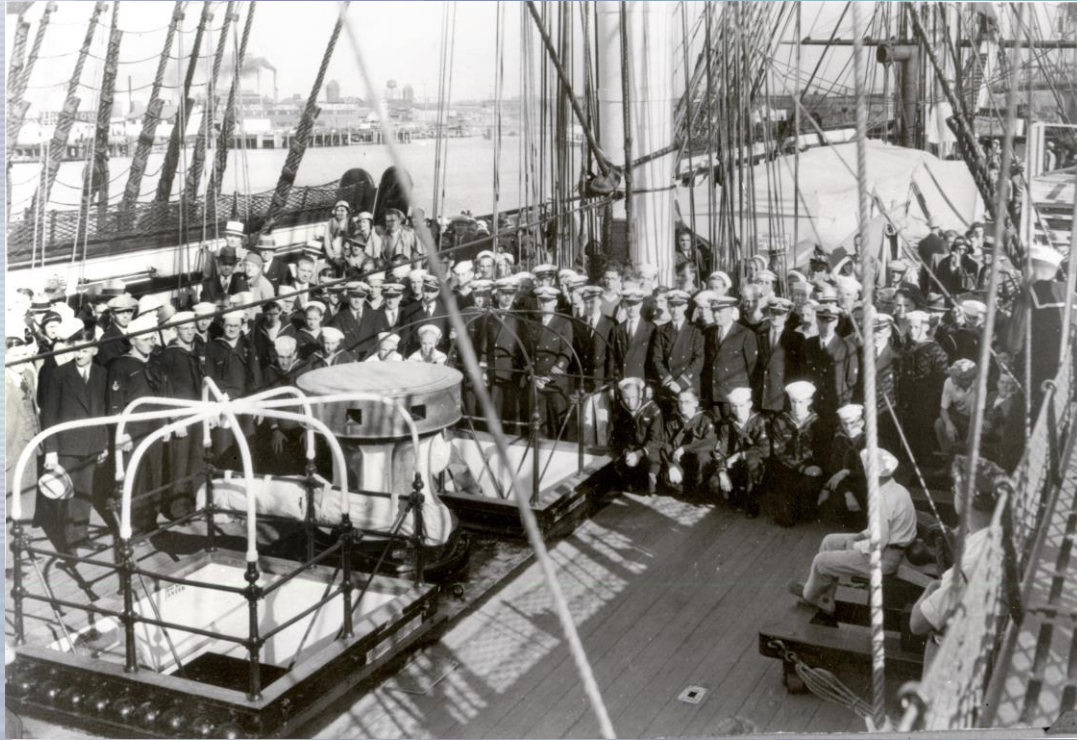

Proclamation

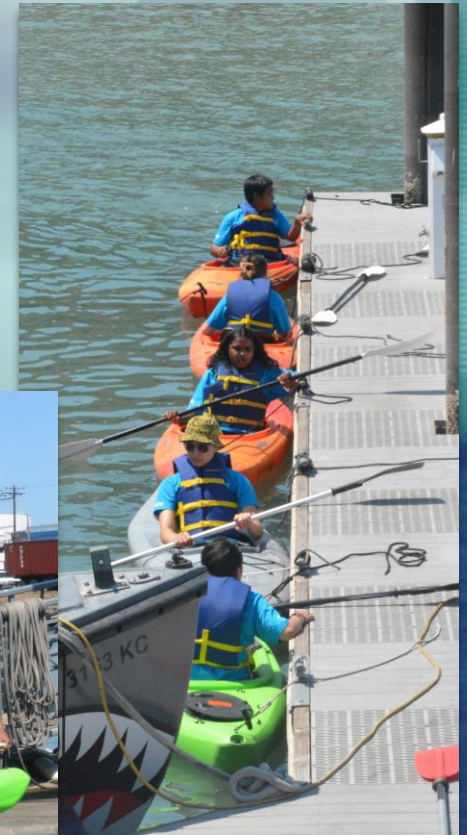

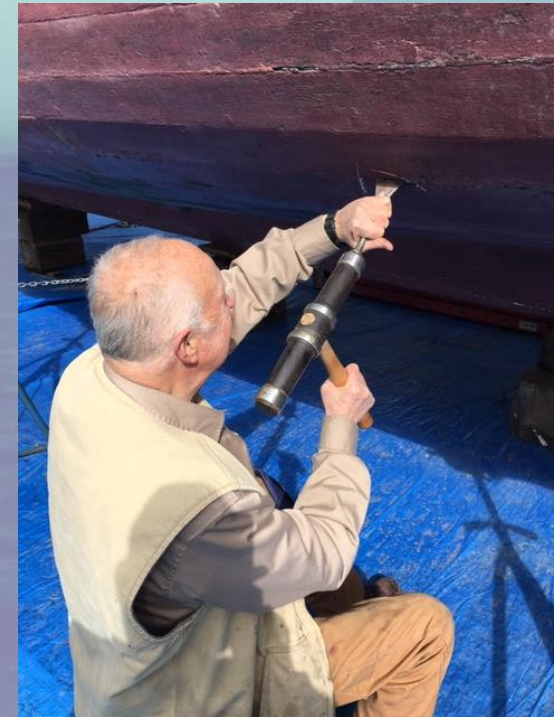
