Background



- In an effort to increase security at the nation's strategic ports, the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) established a Port Security Grant Program (PSGP).
- PSGP provides grant funding to public and private sector partners to support increased port-wide risk management and protect critical surface transportation infrastructure from acts of terrorism, major disasters, and other emergencies.

Background



- The PSGP is currently administered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).
- Since inception (2002) the Port of Tacoma has received an accumulative amount of approximately \$32M in federal funding through the Port Security Grant Program.

- 1. Enhancing Cybersecurity
- 2. Enhancing the Protection of Soft Targets/Crowded Places
- 3. Addressing Emergent Threats, such as Unmanned Ariel Systems
- 4. Training and Exercises
- 5. Equipment and capital projects

Project Award



- Approximately 59 cameras are obsolete and requires replacement to maintain domain awareness and ensure efficient flow of data to other maritime security stakeholders.
- Smaller monitor screens currently located in Security's control center will be replaced with larger screens which will allow for additional streaming of video feeds which today are limited along with replacement of monitor screens for Port operations.

Source of Funds



- The grant award of \$189,540.00 from Department of Homeland Security, Port Security Grant Program Fiscal Year 2021.
- The remaining \$63,180.00 will be funded from Port operations.
- The full amount of \$252,720 will be included in the 2022–2026 Capital Investment Plan.
